



Multisensory "Typeright™" One to One Keyboarding Program

This program is designed to train students ages 8 and up how to touch type using the computer keyboard. The Typeright™ program uses multisensory instruction which has proven to be effective in both teaching touch-typing skills and in motivating students to practice. This method is particularly beneficial for students diagnosed with written output deficit. Developing proficient touch typing skills has become increasingly important for producing legible assignments both at school and at home.

- ◆ Multisensory one to one instruction, students learn through all of their senses (including visual, auditory, kinesthetic and tactile) simultaneously which enhances memory and learning
- ◆ Students will learn will be taught to type using a sequential, alphabetical approach, not the traditional home-row instruction
- ◆ A student manual helps charts progress and organizes assigned home practice
- ◆ Students are assigned a special keyboard cover which shield the keys so that students learn to let their fingers, not their eyes, find the keys
- ◆ Students gain confidence and they become more proficient typists
